Our mission is to provide you with the support and encouragement to continue to learn and live as Christians as we converse with God and each other while growing in our faith.

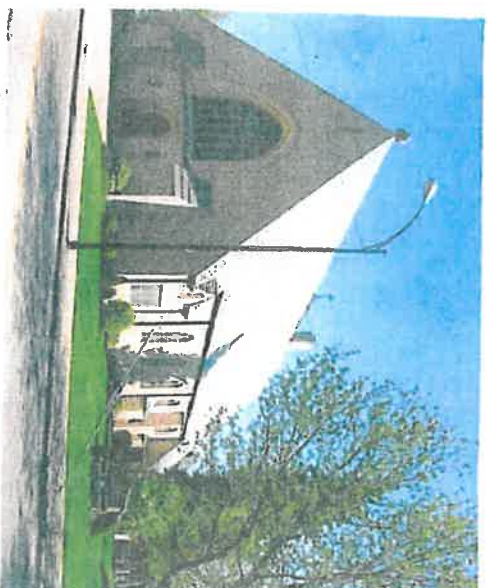
We do this by practicing it with daily prayer, faith sharing, participation in the mass, and the receiving of the sacraments.

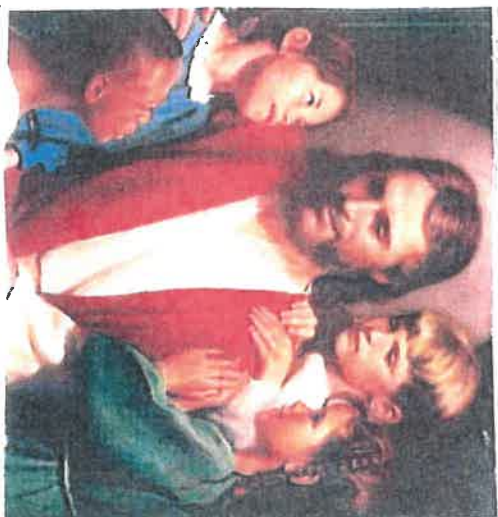
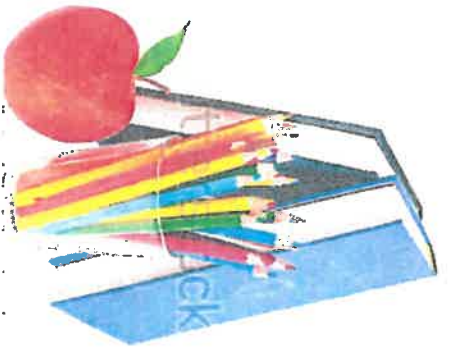
